OFFICIAL 2006 BIKE SHOW AWARDS, RULES, and INFORMATION GUIDE

EXHIBITOR DOOR PRIZES: A number of door prizes will be given away to our bike show exhibitors at the beginning of the awards presentations (all door prize winners are drawn in advance of the awards presentations by the chief show judge). To become eligible – bike show exhibitors must vote by completing their Exhibitor's Choice Best in Show Ballot and returning it by 1:30 PM Sunday, March 12th. (the ballot box will be in the vicinity of the stage). PLEASE NOTE: *Exhibitors must not vote for themselves!* Any exhibitor doing so will be deemed ineligible for door prizes AND disqualified for Exhibitors' Choice Best in Show Awards.

"BEST IN CLASS" AWARDS: 1st and 2nd place "Best in Class" awards plaques (in 34 classes) will be given to exhibitors who placed in individual class competition. Judges' Choice Best in Show winners are removed from individual class competition and, accordingly, are ineligible for Best in Class awards.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARDS: Special Recognition Awards will be presented in recognition of external motorcycle treatments judged best in show competition. In addition, the oldest motorcycle in show competition will be awarded. The winners in each Special Recognition Award category will receive an award plaque plus the following, applicable, cash prize:

Oldest Motorcycle in Show: \$60 (Note: In case of a tie - each winner will receive an award plaque; however, prize money will be shared evenly.)

Best Chrome: 1st place - \$20 • 2nd place - \$15. Best Paint: 1st place - \$30 • 2nd place - \$25 • 3rd place - \$20. Best Special Effects: \$20. Best Upholstery: \$15.

JUDGES' CHOICE BEST IN SHOW: All Judges' Choice Best in Show winners are removed from individual class competition/awards. However, they remain eligible for all other awards. (All entries receive a show class assignment - including Judges' Choice winners). Judges' Choice Best in Show winners will each receive a special trophy plus the following, applicable, cash prize: **1st place - \$150 • 2nd place - \$100 • 3rd place - \$60 • 4th place - \$30**

EXHIBITORS' CHOICE BEST IN SHOW: Exhibitors' Choice Best in Show Awards are additional to all other awards; however, *bike show exhibitors must vote* - turning in their completed Exhibitor's Choice ballots no later than 1:30 PM on Sunday (March 12th) in order to establish eligibility (the ballot box will be in the vicinity of the stage). In addition, *exhibitors must not vote for themselves.* A vote for yourself terminates all eligibility for Exhibitors' Choice Best in Show Awards - regardless of the number of (exhibitor's choice) votes you may have received. Exhibitors' Choice Best in Show winners will each receive a special trophy plus the following, applicable, cash prize: **1st place - \$45 • 2nd place - \$20**

SPECTATORS' CHOICE BEST IN SHOW: Spectators' Choice Best in Show Awards are additional to all other awards. All paid admissions receive a ballot. Two-day event pass holders will get to vote BOTH days. Voting runs Saturday and Sunday; however, ALL balloting closes at 1:30 PM on Sunday. Spectators' Choice Best in Show winners will each receive a special trophy plus the following, applicable, cash prize: **1st place - \$100 • 2nd place - \$60 • 3rd place - \$30 • 4th place - \$10**

CHIEF SHOW JUDGE'S PERSONAL CHOICE AWARD: Ray Kittel (Ray's M/C Show World), Chief Show Judge & Bike Show Event Coordinator for Porker's U.S.A. bike shows, will select his personal choice or favorite motorcycle in show competition. The winner will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$35**.

PROMOTER'S PERSONAL CHOICE AWARD: Bill and/or Deb Holst, show promoters and proprietors of Porker's U.S.A. will select his and/or her personal choice or favorite motorcycle in show competition. The winner will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$35**.

VIP's PERSONAL CHOICE AWARD: A show VIP will select his or her personal choice or favorite motorcycle in show competition. The winner will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$35**.

JUDGES' CHOICE BEST LADIES' RIDE ENTRY: Best ladies' ride entry, as deemed by the judges, will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$20**.

JUDGES' CHOICE BEST THEME BIKE: Best theme bike, as deemed by the judges, will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$40**.

JUDGES' CHOICE BEST NOSTALGIA CUSTOM (Pre-1984): Best nostalgia custom motorcycle, as deemed by the judges, will receive a special trophy plus a cash prize of **\$30**. The winning entry must be state DOT registered as a pre-1984 model. Classic or vintage replica entries do not qualify nor do entries that use an after-market retro motor (S&S, RevTech, etc.) duplicating O.E.M. motors of that era.

FREE SHOW PASSES: Two exhibitor passes for the show will be given for each entry fee paid. Any or all others over the age of 12 in your contingent who desire show day admission will be required to pay regular event admission. These tickets may be purchased on the day of the show OR in advance during exhibitor setup hours (10:00 AM to 9:00 PM) on Friday, March 10th (preferably during the checking in process).

FREE EVENT T-SHIRT: ALL pre-registered & prepaid entries/exhibitors will receive a free Porker's U.S.A. event T-shirt. Please indicate the appropriate size, in the space provided, on the OFFICIAL 2006 BIKE SHOW ENTRY FORM. T-shirts will be handed out, accordingly, upon exhibitor check in on Friday, March 10th. Bike show applications must be postmarked by 3-3-06 in order to qualify for the free event t-shirt.

HOW TO ENTER SHOW COMPETITION & ENTRY FEE RATES: Please read carefully and fill out both sides of the OFFICIAL 2006 BIKE SHOW ENTRY FORM completely. Enclose the applicable entry fee (one of three choices). All entry fees are per show space (limit one motorcycle per space). Bike show space sizes are six feet wide by nine feet deep (6' x 9'). On account of the Ramada Inn Convention Center's up scaled amenities – **DISPLAYS FOR ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED!** This includes carpeting, lighting, turntables, mirrors, woodchips, memorabilia, etc. However, informational, credit, or company signs are encouraged and welcomed. All bike show entry forms must be signed by the owner (and exhibitor – if different from the owner). **There are THREE show spot options available. Indicate on the Official 2006 Bike Show Entry Form the one that is right for you.**

→ **OPTIONS INCLUDE:** One 6' x 9' show spot at the pre-registration & prepaid rate of **\$35** (\$45 "at the door"). One 6' x 9' show spot that features an aisle corner/end cap location (which is ideal for improved spectator viewing) at the pre-registration & prepaid rate of **\$45** (\$60 "at the door"). And, in order to accommodate an oversized entry – a double show spot (12' wide x 9' deep) is available at the pre-registered & prepaid rate of **\$60** (\$80 "at the door"). Please note that aisle corner/end cap spots are not available for double show spots.

PRE-REGISTERED & PREPAID SHOW APPLICATIONS MUST BE POSTMARKED BY MARCH 3, 2006.

SHOW CLASSES: There are 34 Bike Show Classes: On the OFFICIAL 2006 BIKE SHOW ENTRY FORM, exhibitors are requested to indicate the bike show class (in their opinion) their motorcycle(s) belongs in. Our chief show judge reviews all applications for show - taking into account each exhibitor's opinion as to the show class assignment their entry should receive. However, in the interest of competitive fairness and show legitimacies - judges class all bikes contingent to the entire field of entries. Accordingly, and in their experience, they reserve the absolute right to eliminate, condense, modify, expand, and/or create classes, as they deem appropriate. In other words, *judges have absolute & final authority, including, but not limited to - what class your motorcycle(s) will be placed in for show competition.*

JUDGING: Bike show classing & judging is performed by Ray's M/C Show World. Ray's crew is knowledgeable in the motorcycle field with many years of experience. This experience includes, but is not limited to, custom bike building, competing in bike shows, and classing/judging of bike shows. They pledge to do their absolute best to be fair. Entries are judged according to their state of readiness and completion beginning immediately after exhibitor setup hours (9:00 PM on Friday night, March 10th). Accordingly, plan ahead, be prepared, and budget your travel and setup time. Porker's U.S.A. and Ray Kittel (our Chief Show Judge) desire nothing more than to class and judge all motorcycles entered in the show as correctly and fairly as possible. In order to help achieve this, we encourage an informative and progressive dialogue between the exhibitors and show judges. Therefore, if you wish to talk (brag a little) about your motorcycle or have any questions regarding the classification and/or judging process, please feel free to speak to any one of the show judges. Likewise, you may expect them to ask you questions, etc. about your show entry. **Judges' decisions are final in all matters.** All registration, classing, judging, and award forms used are the property of Ray Kittel (Ray's M/C Show World) and are not available for spectator and/or exhibitor viewing or possession.
